

DIRECTIONS FOR VOTING ("SAMPLE" BALLOT OF VOTING MACHINE) GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 6, 2007

1. Move the Red Handle to the Right.
2. Turn the Lever over the name of each candidate you wish to vote for from this position to this position and leave the voting levers DOWN.
3. Turn the Lever over the yes or no of each proposal you wish to vote for from this position to this position and leave the voting levers DOWN.
4. Move the Red Handle to the left.


No one will know how you have voted because the movement of the curtain lever returns the voting levers to the unvoted position before the curtain begins to open.

No votes are registered until the curtain lever is moved to open the curtain, and so you can make as many changes as you desire while the curtain lever is at the right side.

IF NAME IS NOT ON MACHINE
To vote for a candidate whose name does not appear on the machine, raise the diagonal slide (at the top of the machine) over the title of the office, and write therein the name you wish to vote for.

SUGGESTION
Read the Sample Ballot below carefully and decide which candidates you want to vote for and note where the names are located.

Each candidate's voting lever is located just above the name; a voting lever must be turned down over the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote. **Leave voting levers down.** The machine is so arranged that you can turn down only the proper number of voting levers for each office or proposal.

QUESTIONS

PROPOSAL NUMBER ONE, AN AMENDMENT
Amendment to Article 14, section 1 of the Constitution, in relation to the use of forest preserve lands for wells for a municipal water supply in the hamlet of Raquette Lake, Hamilton county.
The proposed amendment would allow the State to convey one acre of forest preserve land to the town of Long Lake for public use as the site for drinking water wells and necessary related equipment for the municipal water supply for the hamlet of Raquette Lake. In exchange, the State would receive at least twelve acres of land that is at least equal in value to the land conveyed to Long Lake. The land the State receives would be incorporated into the forest preserve. The Raquette Lake reservoir would be abandoned as a source of drinking water supply. Shall the proposed amendment be approved?
