The Tompkins County Compliance Committee

The County Compliance Committee is a nine-member working group appointed by the County Administrator. The role of the Compliance Committee is to advise and assist the County Administrator with implementation of the County Compliance Program, which includes:

- Reviewing and assessing existing policies and procedures that address compliance risk issues.
- Working with departments to develop standards and processes that address specific risk areas and encourage compliance according to legal and ethical requirements.
- Developing internal systems and controls to carry out compliance standards and policies.
- Monitoring internal and external reviews to identify potential non-compliant issues.
- Implementing corrective and preventive action plans.
- Developing a process to solicit, evaluate, and respond to complaints and problems.
- Assisting with staff training and outreach.

Privacy and Security Work Group

The Privacy and Security Work Group (PSWG) is a subset of the Compliance Committee that focuses specifically on issues regarding healthcare privacy and security compliance. In response to federal compliance mandates regarding The Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act, an expanded part of The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability (HIPAA) Act of 1996, the general role of PSWG is to advise the larger Compliance Committee on all healthcare-related privacy and security issues including changes to the law, updated compliance mandates, etc. This helps ensure the protection of all Personal Health Information (PHI) across the entire organization. The Healthcare and Security Officer chairs the group and is responsible for taking the lead on PSWG initiatives.
