Project 1: <i>Organizational Development Intern</i>	
Project Description: Wood's Earth Living Classroom's mission is to integrate hands-on education with organic community gardens and school food production. The site features pond-fed drip irrigation, a perimeter deer fence, and a greenhouse. So far in our first season, we sold 14 community garden plots of different sizes, hosted hands-on lessons and work days for GIAC teens and preteens almost weekly, hosted 2 field trips for a Cornell sustainability youth summer camp, hosted various workshops for adults and families, and are growing field crops to sell to the Ithaca School District and donate to BJM's Fresh Fruits and Vegetables Snack Program. Our goals for 2013 include gaining non-profit fiscal sponsorship for the school food and education aspects of the organization, expanding the community gardens to increase annual start-up funds, and expanding field crop production to specifically match the schools district food programs' needs.	
Sustainability Intern's Role: The Sustainability Intern would be responsible for helping with: field work (harvesting, planting, weeding, mulching), event and workshop coordination, outreach and social media, produce sales/donations and logistics, and overall sustainable organizational development goals. <i>It is preferred, but not required, for the Intern to have access to a vehicle. The Intern should be comfortable working independently, though much support and supervision will be provided.</i>	
Skills or Education Required: Gardening and/or farming experience; Comfort with physical labor (ability to lift and carry up to 50 lbs); Interest in sustainable agricultural development; Interest in youth education; Experience or strong interest in networking and organizing. <i>It is preferred, but not required, for the Intern to have access to a vehicle. The Intern should be comfortable working independently, though much support and supervision will be provided.</i>
