

# Online Job Search Resources for Mature Workers

1. **AARP** [www.aarp.org](http://www.aarp.org) has a Work and Career Center, a work training program for lower-income 55+ workers, and collaborates with national employers who are looking for older workers. It also has many articles on job search strategies.
2. **Encore Careers** [www.encore.org](http://www.encore.org) is more about career changes than it is finding a job if you are out of work. It's a good place to combine the two approaches.
3. **Retired Brains** [www.retiredbrains.com](http://www.retiredbrains.com) allows you to post a resume or search for full, part-time, or temporary jobs that are suitable for older workers. There is also job hunting and interviewing tips.
