THE STORY BEHIND THE DATA

GRAPH 1: # of youth served – It is predicted that the goal of serving 140 youth will not be met in 2021. This is due to Covid-19 restrictions on outreach efforts and difficulty in providing in-person apprenticeship opportunities and tours. There was also significant staff turnover in the YEP Coordinator position in 2021, which further impeded outreach efforts.

GRAPH 2: % of parents satisfied with the program – We continue to enjoy high satisfaction from parents based on feedback from evaluations. It is predicted that this performance measure will remain in the 90+% range. Youth voice is the foundation of this program and staff are well trained to identify youth goals through active listening. Youth are happy when they have been able to explore their interest through a YEP activity and then share with their guardian their satisfaction.

GRAPH 3: % of youth increasing their knowledge of specific duties, responsibilities, training, and qualifications chosen field of interest and learning specific skills related to the careers - We anticipate that our annual performance on this measure will fall in the range of 90-96% as history as shown. The Youth Exploration Program enjoys a long and successful tradition of providing experiential learning opportunities in a highly educated and culturally rich environment that affords experiences that are varied and unique. A strong network of community members and exploration hosts are the foundation the program, and the staff support is critical in guiding a youth's experience. The opportunity for feedback, reflection and support built into the program helps youth integrate their experience into their knowledge and lives.
