- Welcome & Moment of Silence
- Breakout Groups
 - Many thanks to Michael Stitley for continuing to support the breakout sessions
- Call Delineation Presentation
 - ██████ Very insightful, and more surprising than I thought it would be. You could see with traffic offenses and complaints, we thought they were more in the category of “it depends.”
 - ██████ Useful exercise, insightful questions into insurance and/or state policies that require an officer to file a report, but must this be an armed responder? Lots of common ground on plenty of calls that were easily put into the unarmed and/or depends categories.
 - ██████ Agreed collectively that IPD is overused and overburdened. All of the “it depends” categories depend on whether there are serious injuries. Possible co-response particularly for psychiatric situations. Group was cautious about generalizing broad categories, which refined the importance of getting more detailed information about calls.
- Call Delineation Suggestions
 - Providing suggestions for call types that have a discrepancy between breakout groups and voting if armed response, unarmed response, or it depends is needed
 - 911 Call hangup - there are a variety of factors that contribute to hanging up. It's possible that they are unable to call back.
 - ██████ This is some of the most important work we are doing as a group and it feels very rushed
 - Hans: We are being intentional about being efficient with the time folks are dedicating toward this effort.
 - Sex Offense -
 - ██████ Passionate about this in particular. Without a specially trained police officer who is responding, it will make it more difficult for victims to have justice
 - ██████ a call type requiring a co-response
 - ██████ also noted from our group that
