Updates:

a. Reimagining Public Safety

Rich John- Working on job descriptions and preparing to post the Director and Data Analyst positions. Discussing a plan with the City around a Memorandum Of Understanding. The key component will be setting up an advisory board, which is critical to get broad representation.

Deanna- Working on a project management software to provide feedback, input, and updates to the public. The Legislature voted to commit to ensure the community is involved in all aspects of the RPS process.

b. Evidence Based ATI Metrics Report and Next Steps

Last month CJATI received a report from CIPA. CJATI has asked CIPA for students to continue their research. Will work with the next group of students to update language used in reports.

c. American Rescue Plan

The Legislature has received half of the \$19.85 million in funds from the federal government. There is an online survey for public input to suggest uses for the funding. The survey closes on June 29th.

d. Long Term Inmate Report

Matt Van Houten- Similar to last months list. The Governor has not signed the parole violation bill yet, but the major change the bill would have is that an individual on parole, and charged with a violation, would have a hearing before incarceration. That would dramatically affect the jail population.
