ITEM III.

Approval of 2025-2026 UPWP and Resolutions 2025-01 and 2025-02

Report: The latest **draft** of the Simplified Statement of Work/UPWP for the April 1, 2025–March 31, 2026 fiscal year has been emailed to committee members for review and comment. The Policy Committee must approve a final UPWP during their February 25, 2025 meeting in order to meet the NYSDOT deadline of March 1. A copy of the draft UPWP was sent to NYSDOT's MPO Bureau for comments and their feedback was incorporated in the document. **Please send any comments you may have to Fernando de Aragón as soon as possible.**

Please note that the draft UPWP includes the following project for use of the required 2.5% Set Aside for Safe and Accessible Transportation Options. The total available is \$9,537.

\$9,537 Town of Dryden - The project includes a feasibility study for phase 3 of the Town of Dryden Rail Trail. The Town of Dryden will study the feasibility of constructing a trail on 3.4 miles between Pickney and Johnson Roads. Work on this project shall include a feasibility study of trail alternatives and an analysis of each alternative.

Additional planning projects and expenses to be funded with FHWA-PL funds include (see draft page 18):

- \$6,000 *Program Expense* for data and mapping analysis, and other tasks per contractor agreement.
- \$6,000 Program Expense for financial and bookkeeping support tasks per contractor agreement.
- **\$9,000** *Program Expense* Town of Ithaca for planning and implementation of transit enhancements that will improve safety and service in the East Hill area by the Town of Ithaca, in coordination with TCAT.
- 15,000 Program Expense Center for Community Transportation for bicycling safety education and training, including acquisition of bicycle safety equipment, and skill education at targeted communities across Tompkins County by Bike Walk Tompkins, a program of the Center for Community Transportation. Events will include distribution of bike safety equipment, free bike repair and multimodal transportation mentoring for individuals and families. Targeted communities include those in rural locations and those whose members are disproportionately affected by financial barriers to reliable transportation.
- \$9,500 Program Expense Town of Lansing for feasibility study for an initial phase of the Lansing Greenway. The Town Center Greenway will connect two parks, a library, community center and town hall to nature trails, housing developments, restaurants, and shops. The primary purpose of this study is to develop a detailed cost estimate. The land required for this trail is either Town owned or on existing easements. This study will prepare the project for construction funding applications.
- **\$10,000** *Program Expense* Planning and feasibility analysis for a wildlife crossing project on Thomas Rd., Town of Caroline

In addition, the work program sets aside \$2,500 to cover expenses related to the Executive Director staff transition. Looking ahead, the principal staff-led initiatives for 2025-2026 will be the completion of the TIP and self-certification and supporting the transition to new staff.

- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* does hereby adopt the 2025-2026 Operating Budget for the period April 1, 2025 through March 31, 2026 and directs the Host Agency to implement said budget;
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* does hereby authorize its Staff Director to take the necessary administrative actions to implement and administer said budget, as represented in "ATTACHMENT A", which is hereby made an integral part of this resolution;
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* does hereby request that the Host Agency take the appropriate actions necessary to cause this adopted budget to be fully implemented without interruption prior to March 31, 2025.

RESOLUTION 2025-02

APPROVAL OF THE 2025-2026 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM

- **WHEREAS,** federal transportation legislation requires that Metropolitan Planning Organizations be established in each urbanized area of over 50,000 in population; AND
- **WHEREAS,** the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* has been designated by the Governor of the State of New York as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Ithaca-Tompkins County Urbanized and approved Metropolitan Planning Areas; AND
- **WHEREAS,** the Metropolitan Planning Organizations are required to carry out a "continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive" urban transportation planning process that addresses all modes of transportation; AND
- WHEREAS, in order to implement a continuous, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process in the Ithaca-Tompkins County Metropolitan Area, it is a requirement to develop an annual Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP); AND
- WHEREAS, the Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council, in accordance with the requirements of regulations (23 CFR §450.308(d)), has developed a Simplified Statement of Work for fiscal year 2025-2026 that serves as the Unified Planning Work Program; AND
- WHEREAS, in order to support the elements of the 2025-2026 Unified Planning Work Program, the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* continues its designation of the New York State Department of Transportation to be the grant applicant on its behalf; AND
- WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation has agreed to apply for necessary regular program funding under the Federal Transit Administration Section 5303 program, under the Federal Transit Administration Section 5307 program, and under the Federal Highway Administration "PL" transportation planning program in amounts consistent with this approved 2025-2026 Unified Planning Work Program;
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* hereby approves the 2025-2026 Unified Planning Work Program and directs the submission thereof to the appropriate Federal and State agencies and directs the filing of the appropriate grant applications to support the program;
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Transportation Policy Committee of the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* hereby authorizes and directs its Staff Director to execute and administer the 2025-2026 Unified Planning Work Program in cooperation with and with the assistance of the Transportation Planning Committee.

<u>2023-27 TIP Actions – Text Amendment</u> <u>Update Highway Safety Performance Targets</u>

Res. 25-03, Supporting NYSDOT's 2025 Targets for Highway Safety Performance Measures

Report: Federal rules require the State to set targets for five safety performance measures in coordination with MPOs. NYSDOT worked with the NY State Association of MPOs and its working groups to develop a set of targets. The Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council may establish safety targets by agreeing to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the State targets or establish its own targets. The ITCTC, along with other NY State MPOs, has opted to support the State targets. Starting in 2017 the ITCTC has passed resolutions annually supporting NYSDOT's targets for safety performance measures. These targets have been updated in the TIP each year. NYSDOT has developed 2025 targets for highway safety performance measures and this agenda item seeks to formalize support for these targets and amends the TIP to add the 2025 targets. Below is draft Resolution 25-03: Supporting New York State Department of Transportation's 2025 Targets for Safety Performance Measures, as well as a TIP amendment form describing how the new figures will be added to the TIP text.

Note: The Planning Committee reviewed this amendment during their January 2025 meeting. Due to lack of inperson quorum, no vote was taken to make a recommendation to the Policy Committee. There were no comments on this item from those in attendance.

RESOLUTION 25-03

SUPPORTING NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S 2025 TARGETS FOR HIGHWAY SAFETY PERFORMANCE MEASURES

- WHEREAS, the Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council has been designated by the Governor of the State of New York as the Metropolitan Planning Organization responsible for the comprehensive, continuing, and cooperative transportation planning process for the Ithaca-Tompkins County Urbanized and approved Metropolitan Planning Areas; AND
- WHEREAS, the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) final rule (23 CFR Part 490) requires States to set initial targets for five safety performance measures by August 31, 2020; AND
- WHEREAS, As required by 23 CFR Part 490, New York State must set annual safety performance targets (5 year rolling averages) for five safety performance measures; AND
- **WHEREAS,** the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) has established year 2025 targets based on five year rolling averages for the following performance measures:
 - (1) Number of Fatalities,
 - (2) Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT),
 - (3) Number of Serious Injuries,
 - (4) Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT, and
 - (5) Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-motorized Serious Injuries, AND

- WHEREAS, the NYSDOT coordinated the establishment of safety targets with the 14 Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) in New York through the New York State Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations (NYSAMPO), AND
- WHEREAS, the Governors Traffic Safety Committee has adopted safety targets for number of fatalities, rate of fatalities and number of serious injuries as set forth in the Highway Safety Strategic Plan (HSSP), and NYSDOT has officially adopted identical 2025 safety targets in the Highway Safety Improvement Program annual report dated August 31, 2024, AND
- WHEREAS, the Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council may establish safety targets by agreeing to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the State targets, or establish its own target within 180 days of the State establishing and reporting its safety targets,
- **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the ITCTC Policy Committee has agreed to support NYSDOT's 2025 targets for the five highway safety performance targets as attached herein, AND
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the MPO Policy Committee directs the ITCT Staff Director to update the 2023-2027 TIP to include the 2025 highway safety targets, AND
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the MPO Policy Committee will plan and program projects that contribute to the accomplishment of said targets.

2023-2027 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Amendment

Updating Highway Safety Performance Targets for 2025 - Text Amendment

The Policy Committee of the Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council (ITCTC) approved an amendment to the text of the 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) on February 25, 2025. The amendment was reviewed by the ITCTC Planning Committee during their January 21, 2025 meeting. The action on the 2023-2027 TIP is described below.

Description:

Federal rules require the State to set targets for five safety performance measures in coordination with MPOs. NYSDOT worked with the NY State Association of MPOs (NYSAMPO) and its working groups to develop a set of targets. The Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council may establish safety targets by agreeing to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the State targets or establish its own targets. The ITCTC, along with other NY State MPOs, has opted to support the State targets. Starting on 2017 the ITCTC has passed resolutions annually supporting New York State Department of Transportation's Targets for Safety Performance Measures. These targets have been updated in the TIP each year. NYSDOT has developed 2025 Targets for safety performance measures. These targets are supported by the ITCTC per Resolution 25-03: Supporting New York State Department of Transportation's 2025 Targets for Safety Performance Measures.

This text amendment to the 2023-2027 TIP follows a format as agreed by NYSDOT and FHWA in coordination with NYSAMPO. The amended text serves to update performance measure safety targets to 2025 as shown in Attachment A (underlined/strike through text) below. The TIP and STIP will remain fiscally constrained.

Attachment A February 25, 2025

Addressing Performance Targets Background Unchanged

HSIP and Highway Safety

On March 15, 2016, FHWA published the final rule for the HSIP and Safety Performance Management (Safety PM) Measures in the *Federal Register* with an effective date of April 14, 2016.

The 2017 New York Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) is intended to reduce "the number of fatalities and serious injuries resulting from motor vehicle crashes on public roads in New York State." The SHSP guides NYSDOT, the MPOs, and other safety partners in addressing safety and defines a framework for implementation activities to be carried out across New York State. The NYSDOT Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) annual report documents the statewide performance targets.

The ITCTC agreed to support the NYSDOT statewide targets for Safety PM measures as shown in the table below, based on five year rolling averages per Title 23 Part 490.207 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Resolutions agreeing to support statewide targets were approved as follows:

- December 19, 2023, Resolution 2023-09: Supporting NYSDOT's 2024 Targets for Safety Performance Measures
- <u>February 25, 2025, Resolution 2025-03: Supporting NYSDOT's 2025 Targets for Safety Performance</u> Measures

FTA 5339 Project Funding Update

The Policy Committee of the Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council (ITCTC) approved an administrative modification to the 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) on February 25, 2025, during a regularly scheduled meeting. The change to the current State Transportation Improvement Program (2023-2027 STIP) affects one (1) Section 5339 project in the FTA Tables for FFY 24/25, as described below and in the attached table.

Description:

Tompkins County, in coordination with TCAT, is requesting an administrative modification to one (1) FTA Sec. 5339 Bus and Bus Facility project. This administrative modification adds funding in FFY 24/25 to reflect actual available funding. The changes include the following:

PIN 382940 - Transit Facility Rehabilitation Project

- Adjust funding for FFY 24/25 for a new total of \$394,358.
 - o Funding breaks down as follows \$315,486 Federal, \$39,436 State and \$39,436 Local.

Multiple New FTA 5339 Projects-FFY 2025

The Policy Committee of the Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council (ITCTC) approved an amendment to the 2023-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) on February 25, 2025, during a regularly scheduled meeting. V. Long-Range Transportation Plan

Report: The Final Draft of the 2045 LRTP is available on the ITCTC web page (www.tompkinscountyny.gov/itctc) (please contact the office, 274-5570, if you need a hard copy). The document includes revisions/update of the federally required section on performance based objectives (in Chapter 1). There have been significant updates to data, maps and text in all other chapters. Appendix C addresses all the public comments received from public meetings and survey, emails, and phone calls. Appendix B includes the glossary of terms and acronyms and an updated list of transportation related web sites. Appendix A shows the Tompkins County Priority Trails Strategy.

The purpose of the 2045 Long-Range Plan (LRP) is to provide members of the Metropolitan Planning Organization, transportation providers, the public, and other affected groups and individuals with an updated Long-Range Transportation Plan for the Ithaca-Tompkins County metropolitan area as required "at least every five years" under 23 CFR Part 450 sect. 324(c). The LRTP was created in response to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Rule (FHWA 23 CFR Part 450 and 771, FTA 49 CFR Part 613, Federal Register Volume 81, No.103, Friday, May 27, 2016.

Development of the 2045 LRTP included a public meeting, online survey, block ads, and broad outreach through mailings, emails. In addition, a web site was developed early in the process that has been maintained with the latest LRTP related information. As usual, all Planning and Policy Committee meetings have been advertised and are open to the public. All comments received during the plan development process were addressed as specified in Appendix C. Comments were accepted throughout the plan development period until November 2024.

The LRTP provides a twenty-year vision for metropolitan transportation in the Ithaca-Tompkins County planning area. It is a fiscally constrained program for federally funded transportation improvements in the amount of \$1.274 billion over the twenty-year life of the plan. In addition, the Plan provides specific recommendations for additional transportation and related planning policies and initiatives that should be carried out to achieve the established goals and objectives.

Planning Committee Action: Resolution 24-08: Approval of the 2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan was Moved by Brent A. Cross, seconded by C.J Randall, and unanimously approved for recommendation to the Policy Committee.

Policy Committee Action: The Approval of the 2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan was Moved by Don Hartill, seconded by Jason Leifer, and approved by consensus.

RESOLUTION 24-08

APPROVAL OF THE 2045 LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN

- WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) (P.L. 117-58 also known as the 'Bipartisan Infrastructure Law') requires that Metropolitan Planning Organizations be established in each urbanized area of over 50,000 in population; AND
- WHEREAS, the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* has been designated by the Governor of the State of New York as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Ithaca-Tompkins County Urbanized Area; AND
- WHEREAS, federal legislation and regulations requires Metropolitan Planning Organizations to carry out a "continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive" urban transportation planning process that addresses all modes of transportation; AND
- WHEREAS, the *Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act* and its existing and proposed rules implementing Metropolitan Transportation Planning (23 CFR 450) require the development and approval of a comprehensive long-range transportation plan; AND
- **WHEREAS,** on December 17, 2019, the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* approved the last update to its comprehensive long-range transportation plan for the Ithaca-Tompkins County Metropolitan Area; AND
- WHEREAS, federal rules implementing Metropolitan Transportation Planning (23 CFR 450) require the transportation plans be reviewed and updated at least every five years in attainments areas; AND
- WHEREAS, in accordance with the adopted <u>Unified Operations Procedures</u> (section II.B.7.g) of the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council*, an updated comprehensive long-range transportation plan, titled as the <u>2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan</u>, has been developed for the Ithaca-Tompkins County Metropolitan Area; AND
- WHEREAS, there have been numerous opportunities throughout the update of the comprehensive long-range transportation plan for the public to provide input to the planning process and to participate in the review of the proposed comprehensive long-range transportation plan; AND
- WHEREAS, the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* attests that this Plan has been developed in compliance with the requirements of the *Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act* and the joint rules for metropolitan planning: 23 CFR Parts 450 and 771, and 49 CFR Part 613; AND
- WHEREAS, the Transportation Planning Committee of the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* has reviewed said Plan and has recommended that the Transportation Policy Committee approve the <u>2045 Long-Range</u> Transportation Plan.
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Transportation Policy Committee of the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* has reviewed the <u>2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan</u> for the Ithaca-Tompkins County Metropolitan Area and hereby approves said Plan; AND
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Transportation Policy Committee of the Ithaca-

Tompkins County Transportation Council hereby agrees that the <u>2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan</u> will be reviewed and updated to appropriately reflect changes in needs, conditions, and assumptions on a regular basis and not less than every five years; AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Transportation Policy Committee of the Ithaca-

Tompkins County Transportation Council hereby authorizes and instructs its Staff Director to submit the necessary copies of the approved Plan to the pertinent State and Federal agencies.

This resolution having been considered and approved on December 17, 2024.
