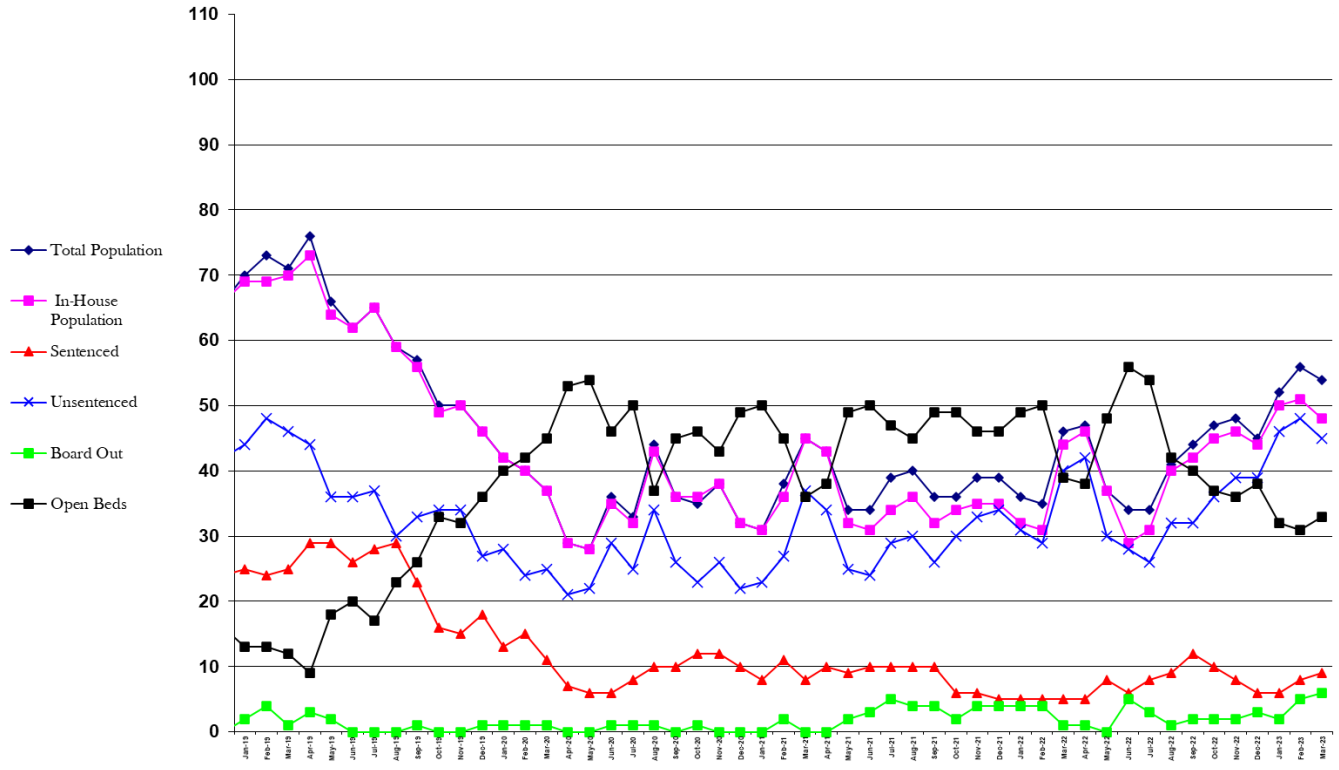

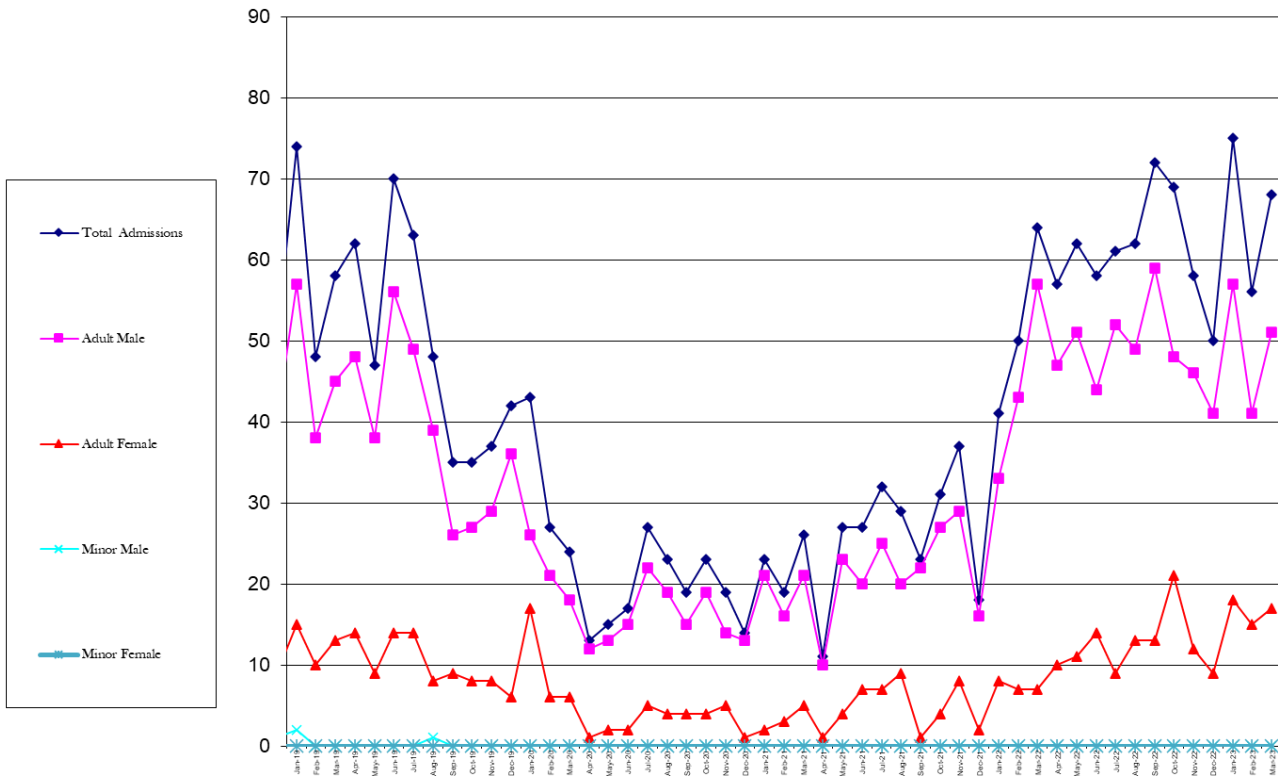

Average Jail Statistics

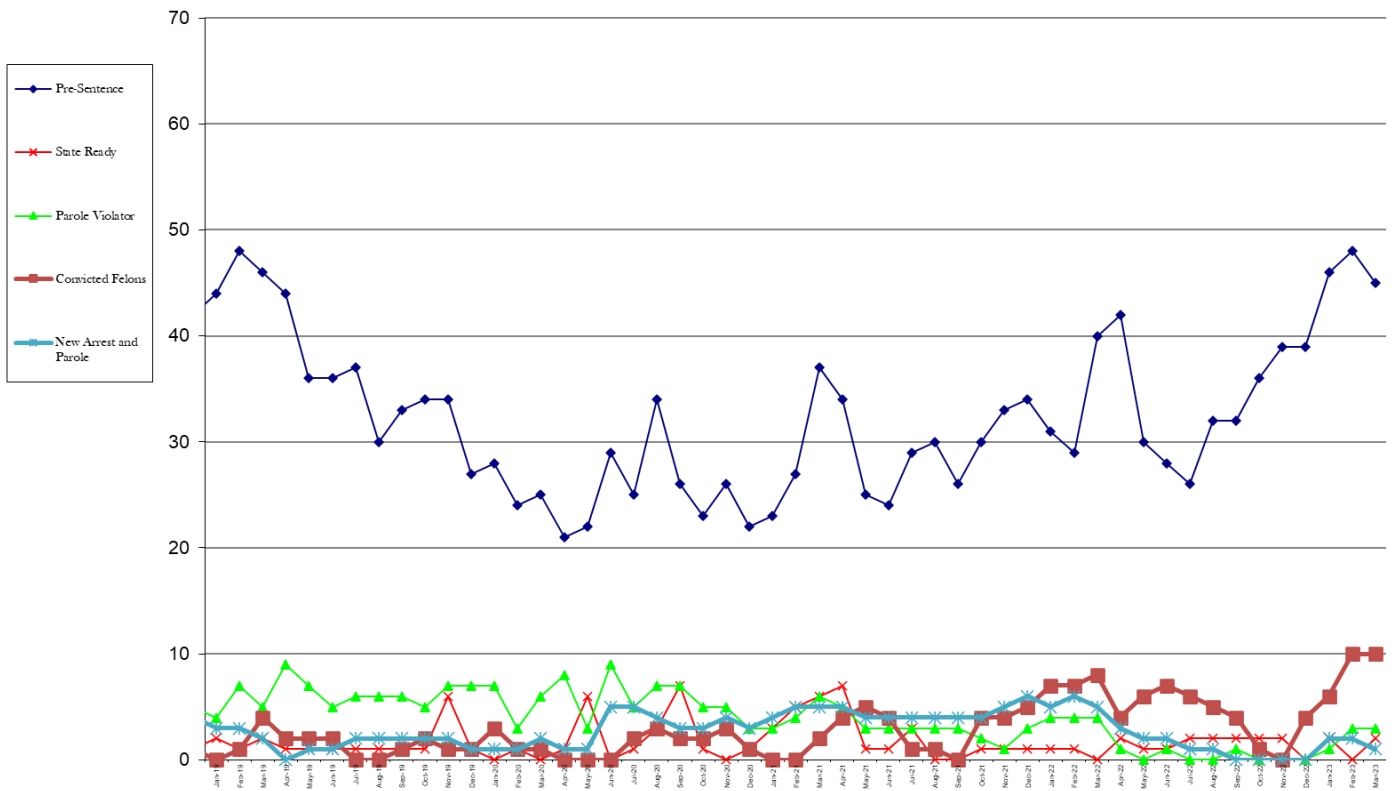


Monthly Admission Totals

Unsentenced Inmate Breakdown (Averages)

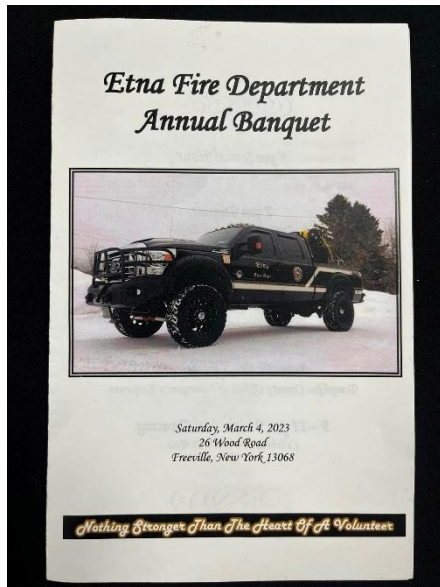


Training

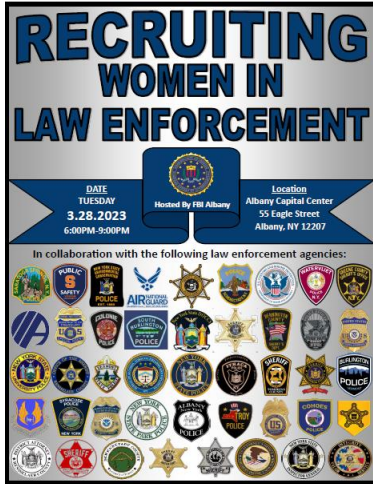

To whom it may concern:

The Tompkins County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol Division provides police services to the community and, as a result, is the most visible component of the Sheriff's Office. Our Road Patrol covers more than 480 square miles with extreme variances in terrain, including Cayuga Lake. We patrol the south end of Cayuga Lake to include the Cayuga Inlet at the southernmost end of Cayuga Lake.

Seventy-five (75) percent of our marine patrol efforts are directed toward boat traffic along the Cayuga Inlet due to the Allan H. Treman State Marine Park, which boasts over 400 boat slips. Along the Cayuga Inlet are boathouses for Cornell University and Ithaca College Crew Teams. There is also access to restaurants by boat. The Cayuga Inlet is a "No Wake Zone" which creates the majority of our boating complaints.

Several members of the agency are a part of the Navigation Patrol Team. The deputies' straight time rate is approximately \$39 per hour and overtime rate is about \$59 per hour. Sergeant Deputy Sheriff straight time rate is approximately \$46 per hour and the overtime rate is about \$70 per hour. Fringe benefits, additional equipment, and uniforms will not be submitted for reimbursement. Fuel costs fluctuate but average \$5.00-\$6.00 per gallon in the Marina.

Our patrol boat is a 2004 Wellcraft, which is docked at the Lansing Harbor Marina located at 44 Marina Road in the Town of Lansing. There are no docking fees or cost for general maintenance of the vessel.

Historically, we try to patrol the lake on weekends and holidays whenever possible. The Navigation Team provides law enforcement coverage to the Cayuga Inlet generally every shift that they are on patrol. Tentatively, we are seeking assistance through this grant to help fund coverage throughout the boating season, May through September, Thursday through Sunday when staffing allows. An average of 4-8 shifts per month would be a reasonable anticipated number of shifts filled dependent on staffing. Each shift requires two (2) deputies or sergeants

per policy. Shifts are a minimum of four (4) hours and typically do not exceed eight (8) hours in a day. Salary costs for the season are projected to be about \$20,000.

We appreciate your time and consideration for the canal grant funding.

This is extremely overdue, but I just wanted to let you know what a positive impact Dalton Kenney has had on my twin boys.
