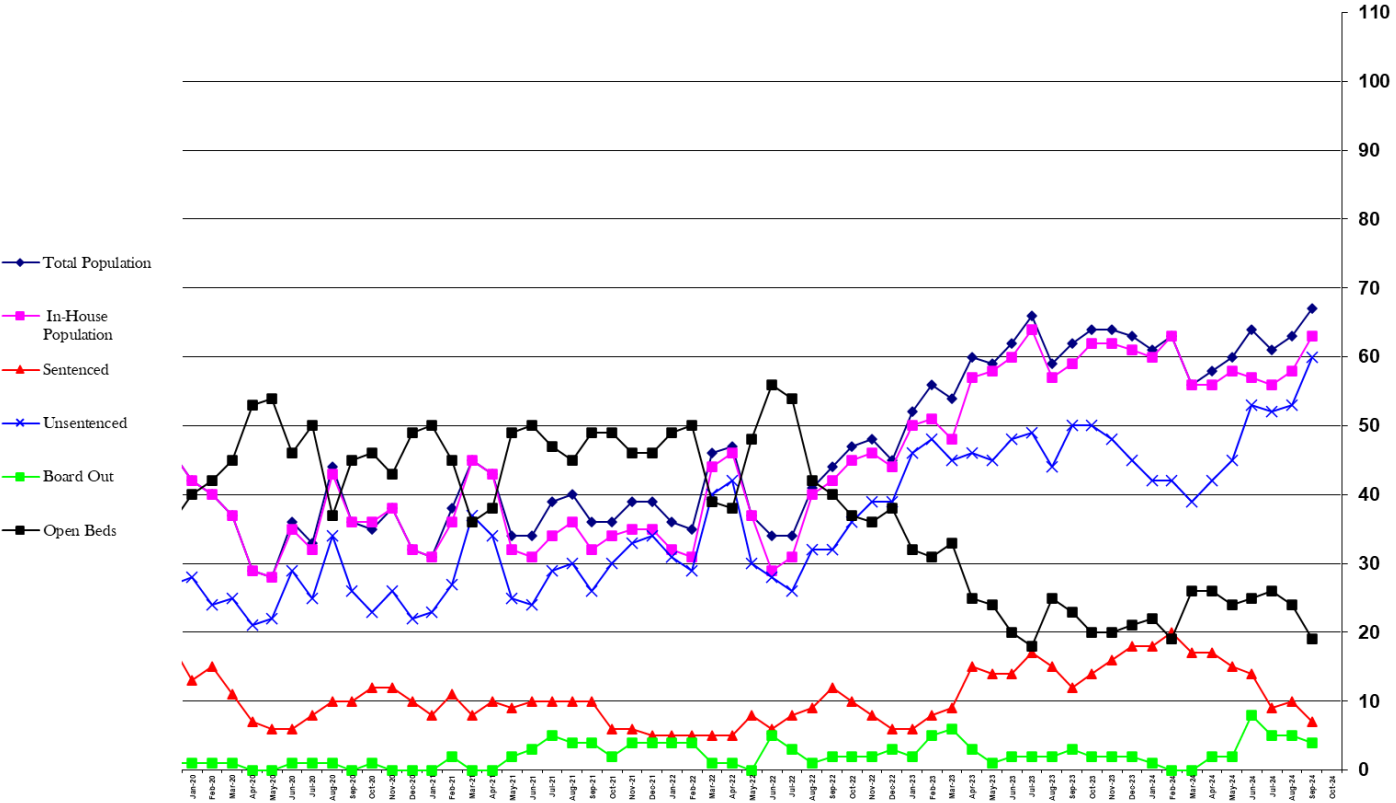

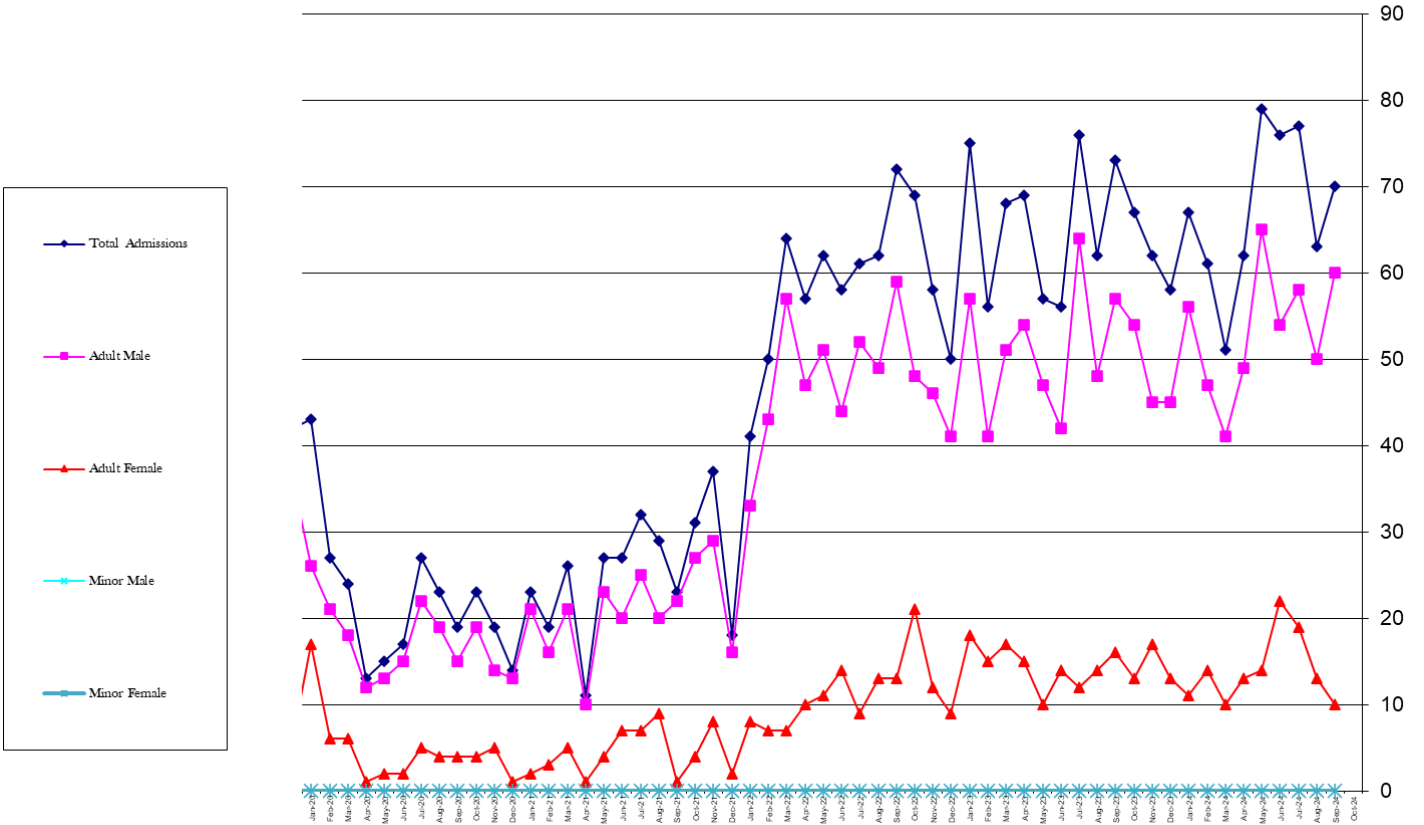

Average Jail Statistics

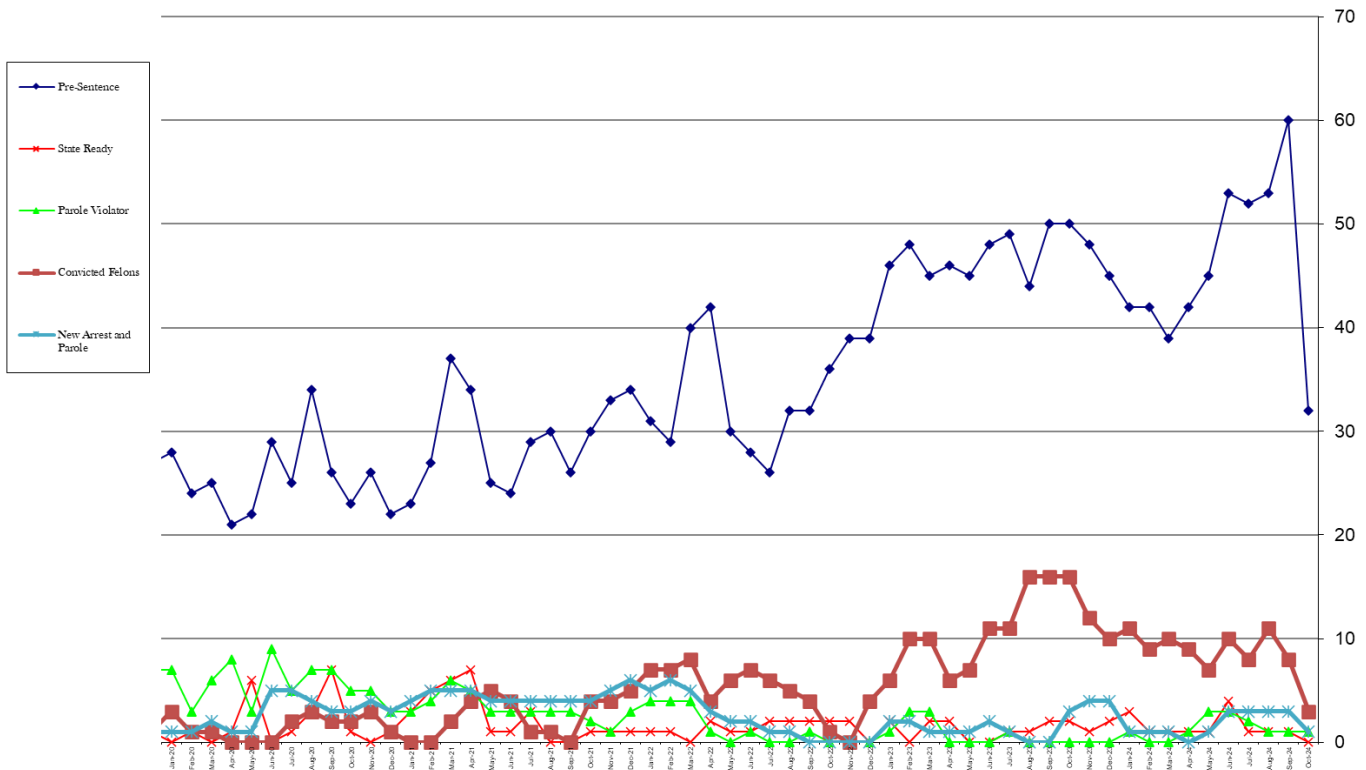


Monthly Admission Totals

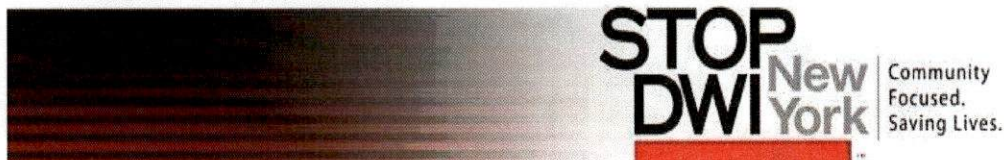

- High visibility enforcement plan must contain Enforcement, Visibility and Publicity.
- All High Visibility Engagement Campaigns must be **multi-agency events**, meaning more than one agency must do some kind of patrol or road check during the designated times (agencies do not have to work together).

AP High Visibility Engagement Campaigns funds cannot be used to enforce navigation laws.

AP Distribute the HVEC dates to your agencies as activity must fall within these dates (unless permission has been granted for alternate dates).


