The final step will be to have organization sign the MOU along with the Tompkins County Legislature Chair and the Workforce Development Board Chair.

Disabilities and Transition Resource Fair on 6/5

Ms. Achilles reported the Disabilities and Transition Resource Fair was held on June 5, 2024, from 4:30 to 6:30 PM at the Ithaca High School Cafeteria. There was a good turnout of 50 to 60 participants and 21 vendors participated. Ms. Achilles reported it was an informative fair and many learned about new organizations that can help with community needs.

Career Center Update

Ms. Achilles reported Mx. Frost reported Workforce Development is in the process of updating brochures, flyers, and ordering new business cards for staff. Ms. Achilles reported the department is working together to make sure they are being efficient and working on procedures. Ms. Achilles reported Workforce Development is reviewing and updating youth policies with Ms. Basilius. Ms. Achilles reported Workforce Development is updating and creating on-boarding procedures, references, and guides for new staff. Ms. Achilles reported the Career Center referred 6 customers to the spring cohort for Direct to Work and all have been offered employment.



Community Based Pre-Vocation (CBPV)

Group setting, currently serving 6 participants (maximum of 8)

The foundation of this program has three parts: Classroom instruction, community exploration and volunteering

➤ Pre-employment curriculum that includes hands-on activities during classroom instruction. Different learning resources are utilized (hands-on projects, multi-media technology, discussion groups, guest speakers)

Mock interviews, travel training with CENTRO, mock cashier/customer service simulations, team building, constructive feedback, professional communication, socialization

➤ All participants volunteer throughout the community as well as we provide community experiences for all CBPV participants to enhance their knowledge of employment and support them with first hand observations of different jobs that align with their preferences and interests.

Volunteer opportunities included: Rescue Mission donation center and Thrifty Shopper, CAP, Heritage Center, Unity House, Beverly's Animal Shelter, Friends of Friends, St. Peter and John Episcopal Church

CBPV prepared/baked, packaged and sold baked goods as a fundraiser. The group raised \$68 and purchased bedding for a partnering non-for-profit, Sleep In Heavenly Peace, who provides beds for children.










