Workplan

OET Update

Ms. Mouillesseaux's presentation is attached

Ms. Mouillesseaux reported that OET has hired the Communication Specialist, Mr. Bennett that will be working with WIOA Youth and Adult. In addition, OET has hired a Project Assistant, Ms. Johanson that will be working with WIOA Youth. OET has one opening for a Workforce Development Specialist.

Ms. Mouillesseaux reported that OET is working on Communications Strategies: Long- and short-term objectives, outreach to marginalized populations; individuals with disabilities, people in re-entry, people in addiction recovery, and other systemic barriers.

Ms. Mouillesseaux reported to the Committee that the OET staff in the 6 months have participated in training: Trauma-Informed practices, Motivational Interviewing, Reentry Awareness, LGBTQ+101, Transgender Youth and Domestic Violence in the Workplace.

Ms. Mouillesseaux is in the process of working with the County Planning, Development and Environmental Quality, Budget, Capital and Personnel Committee's and will be meeting next with Tompkins County Legislature on May 17th to request \$20K in funding to move for with Reimagining the Workplace series.

Ms. Mouillesseaux reported that the OET have increased attendance events and workshops.

NYDOL Update

- Mr. Cerasaro reported to the Committee that NYSDOL and OET are working on a reopening plan. NYSDOL has opened 10 centers across New York as of last week.
- Mr. Cerasaro reported that NYSDOL are in the process of hiring 3 new staff and will be interviewing end of week or next week.
 - Mr. Cerasaro reported that he Career Center has a Security Officer on staff.
- Mr. Cerasaro reported that the goal is to have a soft opening of the Career Center to have time to work out any issues that may arise.
- Mr. Cerasaro reported that the unemployment Insurance issues have been resolved and a hotline has been set up for UI customers.
