

# DIRECTIONS FOR VOTING ("SAMPLE" BALLOT OF VOTING MACHINE) GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 4, 2008

- Move the Red Handle to the Right.
- Turn the Lever over the name of each candidate you wish to vote for from this position to this position and leave the voting levers DOWN.
- Turn the Lever over the yes or no of each proposal you wish to vote for from this position to this position and leave the voting levers DOWN.
- Move the Red Handle to the left.

No one will know how you have voted because the movement of the curtain lever returns the voting levers to the unvoted position before the curtain begins to open.

**IF NAME IS NOT ON MACHINE**  
To vote for a candidate whose name does not appear on the machine, raise the diagonal slide (at the top of the machine) over the title of the office, and write therein the name you wish to vote for.

Each candidate's voting lever is located just above the name; a voting lever must be turned down over the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote. **Leave voting levers down.**

The machine is so arranged that you can turn down only the proper number of voting levers for each office or proposal.


No votes are registered until the curtain lever is moved to open the curtain, and so you can make as many changes as you desire while the curtain lever is at the right side.

<p><b>PROPOSAL NUMBER ONE, AN AMENDMENT</b> Amendment to Article 5, section 6 of the Constitution, in relation to additional civil service credit for members of the armed forces of the United States</p> <p>The proposed amendment would eliminate the requirement that veterans who were disabled in the actual performance of duty in any war be receiving disability payments from the United States Veterans Administration in order to qualify for additional points on a civil service examination for appointment or promotion. Under the proposed amendment, the disability must only be certified to exist by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. The proposed amendment would also update the reference to the "United States Veterans Administration" to instead refer to the "United States Department of Veterans Affairs" to reflect current federal government structure. Shall the proposed amendment be approved?</p>
