Calendar for Lansing Village Election
April 28, 2020

- Feb. 11 First day to sign independent nominating petitions.
- Mar. 17 - 24 Dates for filing independent nominating petitions.
- Mar. 27 Dates for filing statements of receipts and
Apr. 17 expenses for village election - where required -
May 26 pursuant to Rules and Regulations of
New York State BOE.
- Mar. 27 Last day to file certificate of acceptance or declina-
tion of an independent nomination for an office to be
filled at the Village Election.
- Mar. 30 Last day to file certificate filling vacancy caused by a
declination of an independent nomination.
- Apr. 18 Last day for voter to register with Board of Elections
to vote in the upcoming Village Election.
- Apr. 21 Last day for Board of Elections to receive application
for an absentee ballot to be mailed to a voter.
- Apr. 27 Last day for applicant (or his agent) to personally de-
liver application for an absentee ballot to the Board
of Elections.
- Apr. 28 **Election Day - Polls open Noon to 9 p.m.**
- April 30 Last day for Board of Elections to complete canvass
of village elections conducted by the Board of Elec-
tions.

Polling Place:

Registration by Mail - Forms for registration by mail may be obtained at the following offices: Board of Elections, Town Clerk, Village Clerk, Dept. of Motor Vehicles and other State Agencies, or downloaded from votetompkins.com.

Absentee Voting - Civilians may qualify to vote by absentee ballot if their duties, occupation, or vacation requires them to be away from their county of residence on the day of any Village Election. (Including spouse, parent or child accompanying such person).

An application for absentee ballot to be mailed to the voter must be received by the Board of Elections not later than seven days before the Election. If the applicant or his agent delivers the application to the Board of Elections in person, such application must be received not later than the day before the election. Absentee ballot envelopes must be postmarked not later than the day before the election.
