

## ABSENTEE VOTING

### FOR PRIMARY:

<b>June 13</b>	Last day to <u>receive</u> application for ballot.
<b>June 27</b>	Last day to apply in person for ballot.
<b>June 28</b>	Last day to postmark ballot. Must be received by the County Board no later than July 5th.
<b>June 28</b>	Last day to deliver ballot in person to Board of Elections or to your poll site by close of polls (9:00 PM)
<b>MILITARY</b>	
<b>June 3</b>	Last day for BOE to <u>receive</u> application for ballot if not previously registered.
<b>June 21</b>	Last day for BOE to receive application for ballot if previously registered.
<b>June 27</b>	Last day to apply personally if previously registered.
<b>June 28</b>	Last day to postmark ballot. Must be received by the County Board no later than June 29 <sup>th</sup> .

### FOR GENERAL:

<b>Oct. 24</b>	Last day to <u>receive</u> application for ballot.
<b>Nov. 7</b>	Last day to apply in person for ballot.
<b>Nov. 8</b>	Last day to postmark ballot. Must be received by the County Board no later than Nov. 15th. Last day to deliver ballot in person to the BOE.
<b>MILITARY</b>	
<b>Oct. 14</b>	Last day for BOE to <u>receive</u> application for Special Fed/UOCAVA ballot if not previously registered.
<b>Oct. 29</b>	Last day for BOE to receive application for military ballot if not previously registered.
<b>Nov. 1</b>	Last day for a board of elections to receive application for Military/Special Federal ballot if already registered.
<b>Nov. 8</b>	Last day to postmark ballot. Must be received by the County Board no later than Nov. 21.
<b>Nov. 8</b>	Last day to deliver ballot in person to Board of Elections or to your poll site by close of polls (9:00 PM) on election day.

**Civilian Absentee Voting** – may qualify to vote by absentee ballot if they will be away from their county of residence; if they have a temporary or permanent disability or they are the primary caregiver for a person with a temporary or permanent disability on the day of any Primary, Special, or General Election. Applications for absentee ballots to be mailed to the voter must be postmarked not later than fifteen days before the Election. If the applicant or his agent delivers the application to the Board of Elections in person, such application must be received not later than the day before the election. All absentee ballot envelopes that are mailed back to the Board of Elections must be postmarked no later than the day of the election.

Candidates should file statements of expenses on the following dates:

\*During this time period any contribution or loan which exceeds \$1,000.00 must be reported within 24 hours of receipt. This same contribution or loan must also be reported in the Post-Election report.

<b>Aug 8</b>	Last day for clerk of local subdivision to transmit certified copy of the text of proposal, proposition, or referendum to the Tompkins County Board of Elections in order to be placed on the November 8, 2022 General Election Ballot.

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## VOTER REGISTRATION

<b>Feb 14</b>	Last day to change party to vote in primary
<b>June 3</b>	Last day to register in person at the Board of Elections or by mail for the 2022 Primary Election. Completed form <b>must be postmarked no later than June 3<sup>rd</sup> and received at the Board of Elections no later than June 8<sup>th</sup></b>
<b>October 14</b>	Last day to register for the November 8, 2022 General Election. Completed form <b>must be postmarked no later than October 14<sup>th</sup> and received at the Board of Elections no later than October 19<sup>th</sup>.</b>
<b>June 8</b>	<b>Changes of address for the primary election received by this date must be processed.</b>
<b>October 19</b>	<b>Changes of address for the general election received by this date must be processed.</b>

<b>April 21</b>	Last day to file an OTB petition if there has been a declination by a designated candidate.

### INDEPENDENT PETITIONS—STATE & LOCAL OFFICES

To nominate independently, signatures must be obtained of 5 per cent (5%) of the total number of votes cast for Governor, excluding blank and void votes, at the last gubernatorial election (2018) in such political subdivision.

<b>July 1</b>	6-158 (11)	Last day to decline after acceptance if nominee loses party primary.

### PARTY NOMINATIONS OTHER THAN PRIMARY
