Absentee Information for the 2020 November 3 General Election Ballots will be available on October 2, 2020

Getting an Application

NY State requires an application for absentee ballots.

Applications can be obtained in the following ways:

- Call the Board of Elections at (607) 274-5522 to request application(s) be mailed to you
- On your electronic device, go to votetompkins.com, select "forms" in the top left block, choose Absentee Application Forms, and download and print the form
- Stop at the Board of Elections , 128 East Buffalo St., Ithaca, to pick one up
- Go to the State Board of Elections Absentee Portal (linked on our home page), complete and submit per instructions.

Completing the Absentee Application

- If you are requesting the form due to concern about COVID-19 transmission, choose "temporary illness or physical disability" for number 1
- Choose "General Election Only," unless you are also applying for a Village Election ballot.
- Select an option for delivery of ballot. Ballots can be mailed, delivered to you in person at the BOE, or delivered to a representative of your choosing that you name on your application. Your representative must have proof of identification in order to pick up your ballot. Make certain your representative (should you choose one) is known and trusted by you.
- Sign the form. It does not matter if you include your middle initial or not.

Filing the Application

 Applications must be filed by October 27 if mailed, faxed or emailed. Applications can be received over the counter at the Board of Elections up until close of business, November 2. <u>We</u> <u>strongly recommend</u> <u>getting your application to us as soon as</u> <u>possible.</u>
