Work Pays









Now you can start a new job without losing your Public Assistance benefits for six months.



You keep what you earn at your job, and your Public Assistance won't go down for six consecutive months.*



To qualify, your earnings can't be higher than 200% of the Federal Poverty Level for your household size.

^{*} This is a one-time benefit and only applies to Public Assistance. If you also get SNAP benefits, your income, including your Public Assistance benefit, may still be counted to determine your SNAP benefits. Therefore, your SNAP benefits may go down or stop.
