Dear Essential Business Partners,

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to ensure the safety of your employees and patrons. We recognize the increased stress and pressure that many of you are under and appreciate your resilience in this rapidly changing time.

In anticipation of the requirements outlined in Executive Order 202.16, we brought together various mask-making efforts throughout Tompkins County and we are collaborating with TST BOCES to initiate a cloth mask production effort in order to provide cloth masks to essential businesses that need them for employees.

Here's the language from EO 202.16:

For all essential businesses or entities, any employees who are present in the workplace shall be provided and shall wear face coverings when in direct contact with customers or members of the public. Businesses must provide, at their expense, such face coverings for their employees. This provision may be enforced by local governments or local law enforcement as if it were an order pursuant to section 12 or 12-b of the Public Health Law. This requirement shall be effective Wednesday, April 15 at 8 p.m.



Once the Health Department approves your request for masks you will receive a letter indicating approval that you can present at Angelo's Dry Cleaners at 315 North Meadow St. in Ithaca to pick up your masks, we anticipate availability this week.
