II. Approval of Action Summary – January 16, 2024

Action: The <u>Action Summary</u> from January 16, 2024 was <u>Moved</u> by David Roth, seconded by Ruth Groff, and unanimously approved by the ITCTC Planning Committee without modification.

III. <u>2023 – 2027 TIP Actions: Amendments</u>

a. Update of FTA 5307 Table-FFY 2024

Report: Frank Doldo reported the following:

- The amendment allocates remaining balances from FTA Sec. 5307 funding from FFY 20/21 and 22/23 to FTA Sec. 5307 for FFY 23/24, on behalf of Tompkins Consolidated Area Transit, Inc. (TCAT).
- It needs to be included in the TIP to receive the funding.
- The funds will be used for operating assistance, Transit Facility parking lot rehab, office spaces rehab, bus transmission/engine replacement, and the replacement of three TCAT cars.

Brent Cross asked if this would increase parking in the facility lot. Curt Parrish replied that the parking lot rehab project will include paving and the painting of parking spots which should open more available spots for vehicles.

The amendment was reviewed and approved by the ITCTC Planning Committee on March 19, 2024. Description:

Tompkins County, in coordination with TCAT and NYSDOT, requests the ITCTC approve the 2023-27 TIP/STIP amendment to the FTA Tables in FFY 23/24. The amendment allocates remaining balances from FTA Sec. 5307 funding from FFY 20/21 and 22/23 to FTA Sec. 5307 for FFY 23/24, on behalf of Tompkins Consolidated Area Transit, Inc. (TCAT). The funds will be allocated for five new projects and one existing project as shown below. Five New Projects:

- Operating Assistance TCAT.
- Transit Facility Parking lot rehab project
- TCAT office space project
- TCAT Boiler replacement project
- Bus transmission/ engine replacement

One Existing Project:

TCAT replacement cars

Funds totaling \$251,982 from FFY 20/21 and \$1,126,856 from FFY 22/23 will be used, for a total of \$1,378,838 being allocated to the above six projects in FFY 23/24.

IV. Bridge NY

Report:

- Applications from Tompkins County were evaluated by a scoring team; it is now the recommendation stage.
- The ITCTC needs to recommend project(s) for BNY funding. Eventually, selected projects will be added to the TIP/STIP. The scoring team for BNY projects was made up of representatives from NYSDOT Structures, NYSDOT planning, the ITCTC, Tompkins County and municipal representative(s).
- Dave Roth reported that, out of five projects, one stood out for the \$5.45M and that is the Falls Road over Taughannock Creek project.
- Fernando de Aragón explained that it was decided it would be strategically better to fund one expensive project with Bridge NY money since the TIP wouldn't be able to. It is hoped that the TIP can find the funding needed for some of the other less-costly projects. He added that there will be a call-for-projects for the TIP in the fall.
- Katie Bergan reported that NYSDOT retains 10% of funds to cover possible project cost overruns.
- Ray Burger said he understands the strategy for choosing Falls Road but asked if there was any way to fund the
 Mill Street Bridge in Dryden since it was the highest scoring project. Dave Roth replied that the money can not
 be used to partially fund another project and that most of the other projects were OSB (off system bridges). OSB
 funding is challenging so Mr. Roth said he would see what NYSDOT can do for priority projects for the TIP; he
 added that there will be more Bridge NY funding opportunities in the future.
- After a discussion among committee members, it was agreed to approve the use of Bridge NY funds for the Falls Road project but to include the following language in the minutes: ITCTC staff is directed to report to the Policy Committee that the Planning Committee recommended to NYSDOT to move forward with their endorsement of the Falls Road over Taughannock Creek project being awarded the Bridge NY funding.

Five applications were received from Tompkins County applicants. The table below presents summary data from applications and the overall score from the evaluation process.

Action: Moved by Ruth Groff, seconded by C.J. Randall and unanimously recommended that ITCTC staff is directed to report to the Policy Committee that the Planning Committee recommended to NYSDOT to move forward with their endorsement of the Falls Road over Taughannock Creek project being awarded the Bridge NY funding.

V. Director's Report

Report:

- Transportation Equity Needs Assessment (TENA) Update is wrapping up and the report will be distributed to committee members soon.
- Crash Report article in Ithaca Voice, 3/6/24. Updated report online: <u>Summary Report High-crash Road Segments And Intersections In Tompkins County, NY 2018-2022</u>. This report is on the ITCTC website; there is a snapshot for each municipality, contact the ITCTC.
- Ithaca Carshare has received insurance and restarted; encourage support of the restart and help get the word out. The bikeshare numbers are looking very good with potential for growth.
- LRTP Update: staff have been working on the update and Iron Design has been contracted to assist with design
 work. A press release has been sent out. A web survey was developed and is online; information will be distributed
 to committee members for their municipal newsletters and web sites to encourage participation across the county.
- Bike Suitability map is being updated this year and should be ready for distribution by late spring.
- TIP Update will start this fall with a new TIP approved in 2025. Members should start thinking of projects to be prepared for the call-for-projects in the future. Active projects on the existing TIP will receive funds first; call the ITCTC with questions. Dave Roth told everyone to expect flat allocations. Brent Cross asked if social justice goals make projects less competitive. Dave Roth replied that this will continue to be a federal consideration. Fernando de Aragón reported that, in the past, a TIP sub-committee made up of applicants working together to come up with a recommendation to the ITCTC Committees. Tim Logue added that this method within the ITCTC has a history of working together and getting important projects advanced.
- Safe Streets For All consultants are moving along with meetings and full access to all crash data.

VI. Member Reports

Report:

1. Dave Roth (NYSDOT Region 3).

- The Route 13 public meeting will take place April 3rd from 5 to 7 pm at Ithaca High School. This will be a big repave and signals project; preliminary design is ongoing now, final design is expected after input from the public meeting. There will be curbs, sidewalks, drainage, paving, signals by the state; it is a major project throughout the city on Route 13. Construction is expected late 2025 into 2026. Katie Borgella suggested getting municipalities involved in spreading the word about the public meeting. C.J. Randall asked what relationship this project has with the Build project on Route 13; Tim Logue replied that nothing in this current project hinders work in the Build project which could be ten years away from construction.
- C.J. Randall asked NYSDOT if there was any news on the TAP. Dave Roth replied that the applications are moving
 to Albany now but it takes a while, often months, for announcements to be released.

2. Tim Logue (City of Ithaca).

- The Build grant project held a public meeting last month; several ideas were presented for crossings The city will be picking preferred draft alternatives and looking for feedback.
- Construction on Stewart Avenue Bridge over Fall Creek: it will be closed most of next summer (2025) with a detour to the Thurston Avenue Bridge. Addisu Gebre added that the bridge will remain open for pedestrians and bicycles.
- The Black Diamond Trail Bridge over the flood canal is open to the public; there will be additional work done in the spring.
- Work is being done on the Gateway Trail to Buttermilk Park but construction may not happen until 2026.

3. Brent Cross (Village of Cayuga Heights).

- The Village is managing two TAP projects: the Kline Road sidewalk bids came in high after Covid but a way was
 found to add money and after a meeting yesterday things are being managed. The Cayuga Heights Road sidewalk
 project selected Hunt Engineers; public outreach will be done after the design work is in.
- An application was done for culvert work under Cayuga Heights Road; it is a deep, 100 foot horizontal and vertical, with a falling apart embankment. The Village is hopeful it will secure a Culvert NY grant.

4. Michael Allinger (Town of Newfield).

- The sewer project begins next month and is expected to be completed by July.
- A meeting is scheduled with Safe Streets For All tomorrow and the crash report will be very useful.

IV. Amendment to the 2024-2025 UPWP

Report: Fernando de Aragón reported that the FTA notified the ITCTC of a change to its appropriation, reducing the amount by \$747 in the 2024-2025 UPWP FTA funds. This amendment adjusts the FTA budget by reducing the travel & training line item by \$747.

Action: Resolution 24-04, *Approving Amendments To The 2024-2025 Unified Planning Work Program*, was <u>Moved</u> by Rod Howe, seconded by Jennifer Biloski and approved by consensus.

RESOLUTION 24-04

APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE 2024-2025 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM

- **WHEREAS,** federal legislation requires that Metropolitan Planning Organizations be established in each urbanized area of over 50,000 in population; AND
- WHEREAS, the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* has been designated by the Governor of the State of New York as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Ithaca-Tompkins County Urbanized and approved Metropolitan Planning Areas; AND
- WHEREAS, federal transportation legislation requires Metropolitan Planning Organizations to carry out a "continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive" urban transportation-planning process that addresses all modes of transportation; AND
- WHEREAS, in order to implement a continuous, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation-planning process in the Ithaca-Tompkins County Metropolitan Area, the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* has developed and adopted the 2024-2025 Unified Planning Work Program, which is in accordance with federal requirements; AND
- WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) has updated the 2024-2025 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5303 Allocations to Metropolitan Planning Organizations based on the latest posting of the Section 5303 Metropolitan Planning Program apportionment by the FTA; AND
- **WHEREAS,** the updated allocations to the Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council result in a decrease of \$747 in 2024-2025 FTA funding to the UPWP Operating Budget;
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* does hereby amend the FTA funds in the 2024-2025 Operating Budget (Table 2) to accommodate a decrease of \$747 by reducing funding for the TRAVEL/TRAINING budget line by that total amount. This budget adjustment is to be reflected across the 2024/2025 FTA Section 5303 Auditable Budget (Table 4). The updated budget tables are included in the attachment to this resolution.

Ithaca Tompkins County Transportation Council Resolution 24-04

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* does hereby amend the *Programmatic Funding Summary* (Table 1) and related text under the *Funding Summary* section of the 2024-2025 UPWP to reflect the budget amendments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the *Ithaca-Tompkins County Transportation Council* hereby authorizes and directs its Central Staff Director to submit the necessary copies of this amendment and any necessary revisions to the 2024-2025 Unified Planning Work Program document to the pertinent State and Federal Agencies.

- Bridge NY Update: During its March 19, 2024 meeting, the ITCTC Planning Committee approved the choice of the Falls Road over Taughannock Creek project for use of the Bridge NY funding; we are awaiting announcement of the award. It is hoped that design work can be done in 2025 and construction in 2026.
- The TIP will start its update in the fall of 2024; approval will be in 2025.
- LRTP Update: A public meeting will be scheduled for early June, to be held at the public library downtown. The web survey has received 145 responses so far. Staff continues to work on the update.

2. Dave Roth (NYSDOT Region 3).

- The open house of the Route 13 project was successful with a good turn out. His office is going through the comments now and hope to have design approval next month. Michael Lane added that he attended the open house and found it to be very well done with a good presentation.
- The DOT program update has begun and should be completed by mid-summer, it is the precursor to the TIP update.

3. Don Hartill (Village of Lansing).

• Cayuga Heights road paving will be done soon in the area of the recent sewer project.

4. Jennifer Biloski (Village of Cayuga Heights).

- The Walking Safe project is moving forward; Kline Road will be closed, it will be an 8 to 10 week project...
- A public meeting will be scheduled in early May on the Cayuga Heights Road project.

5. Tim Logue (City of Ithaca).

- The Stewart Avenue Bridge will be closed, with a detour, in order to replace the deck.
- Working on a cloud-based system for the Smart Grant signal priority project.
- Safe Streets For All is having its public outreach with a website, data collection, and gathering public input.
- The Black Diamond Trail (BDT) Bridge over the Flood Control Channel work is being cleaned up this spring.
- There is a preliminary plan to extend the BDT to Buttermilk Falls.

6. Rod Howe (Town of Ithaca).

• The South Hill trail extension will provide connection between four towns. They got an easement to Tioga County and are looking to do a feasibility study. Fernando de Aragón added that funding possibilities are being looked into.
