<u>Opening Remarks/Changes to the Agenda/Privilege of the Floor</u> –Chair Brett Bossard welcomed everyone to the meeting at 3:06pm. No changes to the agenda.

<u>Action: Approval of May 2023 STPB Draft Minutes</u> – The draft May 2023 minutes were approved as submitted (moved by Doug Levine, seconded by Marian Levy Ware).

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<u>Chair's Report</u> – Brett Bossard

Brett thanked Doug for hosting. He also shared that David Harker departed his position at Ithaca College. Staff will work with Ithaca College to recruit a new STPB representative.

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<u>Staff Report</u> – *Nick Helmholdt*

Nick updated group on the request for proposals process for the Visitor Profile Study, a request for quotes for organizational mentoring for Arts and Cultural Organization Development Stabilization Recovery Fund recipients, and a Strategic Tourism Implementation grant application from the Downtown Ithaca Alliance.

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<u>Presentation: Downtown Ambassadors & Tompkins Festivals Update</u> – Terel Marshburn, Galen

- 26 Gary Ferguson introduced staff from DIA, who reported on the Downtown Ambassadors and
- 27 Tompkins Festivals programs. The presentation covered multiple topics, including responsibilities
- of "clean team" and "hospitality" ambassadors; graffiti removal; trash removal enforcement;

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placemaking budgetary constraints; collaborations with community outreach workers; the equipment lending program; technical assistance; and educational offerings related to safety, permitting, marketing, and fund-raising for event planners. Staff from the Festivals Program shared some of the challenges they've faced, including acquiring adequate storage space for equipment, additional restrictions related to permitting, cost increases tied to event safety, and more. Members asked about new festivals, protocols for emergency situations, and more.

Report/Action: ACOD – Stabilization & Recovery Fund (SRF) Grants – Megan Barber, CAP Megan provided an overview of the ACOD-SRF grant program, highlighting review and selection process, numbers of applications submitted (12 ACOD recipients out of 16 decided to apply, with all meeting eligibility requirements), planned use of funds, and other considerations. In addition to the grant awards, \$20,000 is proposed for Community Arts Partnership to assist with grant administration and monitoring. Q&A discussion touched on disbursement timeline, contract amendments, issuance of a request for qualifications to identify organizational mentors to work with the recipients, and more.

Action: Ken Jupiter made a motion, seconded by Alexis Zaharis Grimm, to recommend the slate of Arts and Culture Organizational Development Stabilization and Recovery Fund grants be awarded funding. Motion carried. Doug Levine abstained.

Report/Discussion: Community Arts Partnership (CAP) Over Target Request --- Megan Barber
Megan reprised over target request (OTR) process from last year, when County awarded CAP
\$132,000 to support administration of three grant programs, and a proposed OTR for the 2024
County budget, which would support regrants in these three programs and CAP's administration of these funds. Her report and the subsequent discussion covered numerous topics. These included grant funding and evaluation process, NYS community regrant partners and multiplier effect,
Community Celebrations grant program, outreach to rural communities, STPB budget reserve and surplus policy, County budget process, and more. Group decided not to vote on recommending the 2024 OTR; it may however be submitted for consideration as a member-filed resolution at the Legislature.

Member Announcements

Members shared events and news of interest to the community. These included Ithaca Reggae Fest, Trumansburg Porchfest, Movies in the Park, performances at Triphammer Arts, DeWitt Park Tuesday Farmers Market, \$20 burger deal night at Inn at Taughannock, Ithaca Arts Market, rehab work at the State Theatre, and more.
