- 6 <u>Call to Order</u> Chair Cait Darfler called the meeting to order at 4:07pm.
- 7 <u>Agenda Review/Public Comment</u> No agenda changes or public comments.

9 **Group Check-in:Icebreaker Activity** – Members broke into small groups and shared their favorite pranks.

12 Approval of Minutes – The April 2024 draft minutes were approved (motion by Christine Collins, second by Steve Bissen) as submitted.

Presentation/Discussion: EMC Bylaws Revisions – Cait Darfler

- 16 Cait led the group in a discussion on revising the bylaws. They reviewed the document's content to
- 17 ensure it aligned with current goals, including incorporating sustainability and promoting biodiversity.
- Subjects covered included membership structure, officer roles, committees, and the formal procedures
- 19 for amending the bylaws itself. A major topic was adapting quorum requirements due to County
- 20 template updates, potentially reducing municipal and village seats while adding student representation.
- 21 To help new members integrate, the group proposed a "buddy system." They also discussed
- 22 standardizing seat terms and eliminating village representation. The group will review the document in
- 23 July with a potential vote in the same meeting for implementation in January. Cait clarified procedures
- 24 for reviewing documents and member involvement in signing petitions and letters of support.
- 25 **Executive Committee Report** Cait reported that the May meeting at Stewart Park had a good turnout,
- 26 with presentations from municipal groups and time to socialize. The executive committee signed two
- 27 letters of support, one related to the Cargill salt mine and another for the South Hill Rec Trail expansion.

- 28 Additionally, Cait reported that the EMC website is being updated. Steve Nicholson then shared
- 29 information about the annual NYSACC conference, taking place September 18-20 in Booneville, New
- 30 York, which will feature virtual talks, field trips, and a reception, with reasonable attendance costs and
- 31 affordable accommodations available.
- 32 <u>Town of Ulysses Update -- Chris Collins</u>
- 33 Chris provided an overview of the town, covering its history, natural resources, conservation efforts,
- 34 community initiatives, and planning activities. She discussed the town's indigenous roots and military
- 35 tract history, and highlighted its natural assets, including Taughannock Falls State Park and the Black
- 36 Diamond Trail. The Conservation and Sustainability Advisory Council leads clean energy and smart
- 37 growth initiatives and participates in the comprehensive plan update. The town has also been
- designated a Bee-Friendly Community, has an active Tree Advisory Committee, and has hosted Earth
- Day and Arbor Day events. Chris touched on planning activities, including zoning maps, and noted the
- 40 town has achieved certifications and grants, including a \$60,000 clean energy grant.
- 41 <u>Municipal Reports (as needed)</u> None
- 42 <u>Committee Updates (as needed)</u> None
- 43 <u>Staff Report (as needed)</u> The department is applying for a \$75,000 grant from NYSDEC for a stream
- 44 corridor analysis and flood risk assessment for Six Mile Creek. Additionally, Shawna Stevenson has joined
- 45 the staff as the new Housing and Community Development Planner.
- 46 Member Announcements Members discussed the problem of abandoned oil and natural gas wells and
- 47 possible action the EMC could take on this issue.
- 48 Meeting Wrap-up Members were encouraged to review the draft bylaws and send feedback to Cait.
