Why Reuse?

Triphammer ReUse Center

2255 N Triphammer Rd Ithaca, NY (est. 2008)

Offering reusable building materials, furniture, household goods, and computers and electronics, and now offering textiles and books.



Ithaca ReUse Center

214 Elmira Rd Ithaca, NY (est. 2015)

This location also houses our eCenter computer repair services, our ReSET job training program, and lumberyard. In 2017 this location had an average 165 visitors and 30 walk-in donations per day.

Deconstruction

An alternative to demolition (est. 2009)

Keeps building materials in use and out of landfills, including doors, windows, cabinetry, hardware, lighting, flooring, insulation, and structural lumber. Deconstruction can salvage 70%-90% of valuable existing building materials.



eCenter

Computer Refurbishment Program (est. 2010)

The eCenter has refurbished and sold 1,800 computers and printers since it first opened in 2010. We also offer discounted computer repair services to nonprofits!



















Ithaca Fixers Collective

Volunteer repair group (est. 2012)

Meeting once a week on Saturdays at the Ithaca ReUse Center, volunteer fixers have logged over 1,000 repair projects!





Job Training Program (est. 2013)

To date, we've provided more than 12,000 hours of job training, with 115 participants to date and 18 active partner organizations, including local employers and volunteer expert instructors.




Impacts of Finger Lakes ReUse Programs

- ★ More than 4 million pounds of materials reused that's more than 38 pounds of stuff per person in Tompkins County!
 - **★ 115 people trained in ReSET Program**
 - ★ 37 living-wage local jobs created
 - ★ 3,100 free pickups of materials provided to Tompkins County community members
 - ★ 110,000 volunteer hours contributed by community members and counting!



Community ReUse Center Business Model

- Scale is working! With more people, space or outlets, we can increase all mission-based impacts
- Provides convenience offer ease of engagement
- We sell more when we price more - different than traditional supply/demand
















Earned vs. Contributed Revenue over time (\$)





Immediate strategies for 2019:

- Leverage growth to begin to address the actual scale of the waste problem
- Serve an estimated 156,000 visitors to our ReUse Centers, accept 20,000 material donations, work with 175 volunteers and trainees, and employ nearly 40 people in living wage jobs!
- Support 89% of entire operations through sales and service revenues
- Develop educational messaging promoting reuse and creative reuse programming





In the next ten years, ReUse will:

- Maximize convenience to donate materials and access affordable goods
- Expand in order to be an effective catchment system to match the volumes of reusable materials currently being landfilled
- Develop and expand existing programming
- Create more jobs
- Provide resources to other communities interested in starting their own reusebased business
