


CORRECTIONS DIVISION POPULATION

Unsentenced Inmate Breakdown (Averages)



- **August 26, 2024:** The Sheriff's Office would like to thank the Ultimate Reentry Opportunity of Tompkins County for their partnership in revitalizing the jail garden program. The intent of the program is to teach our incarcerated population to raise crops on a small scale. When they are released, they will have the ability to grow their own food. This program also provides the opportunity to be involved in something they can take personal pride in and a feeling of accomplishment. The food grown is utilized by the kitchen during meal preparation and donated to local food pantries.





ACTIVITIES CONTINUED

 August 100 Days of Summer Dates and End of Summer HVEC Dates: TCSO, municipal law enforcement agencies, and the STOP-DWI program across the county participated in the statewide End of Summer High Visibility Campaign effort. As part of this effort, on August 31, 2024, TCSO partnered with Dryden Police Department to conduct a sobriety checkpoint.







• August 29, 2024: In coordination with Tompkins County STOP-DWI program, the Sheriff's Office released the STOP DWI Dashboard. The dashboard provides statistics on alcohol and drug related collisions, alcohol and drug related traffic stops, and High Visibility Engagement Campaign efforts among all local law enforcement agencies (excluding the NYS State Police). The hope is that this dashboard will provide insight into local alcohol and drug impaired driving trends and provide transparency to the community regarding the enforcement efforts of the local STOP-DWI Program.
